## Spotlight: How Does our Congregation "Work"?

UUFGC is a member of the Unitarian Universalist Associa-

tion, a religious organization that combines two traditions: the Universalists, who organized in 1793, and the Unitarians, who organized in 1825. They consolidated into the UUA in 1961. Our membership in the Association provides services that we cannot provide for ourselves. Examples of this are presence in national and international public policy and social action arenas, and publications such as the **UU World** magazine which is mailed to all members. We help to govern the UUA by sending delegates to the annual Delegate Assembly which is held in various locations around the country. You can read about UUA at http://www.uua.org/aboutus/index.shtml.

Like all of the 1,041 member congregations in the United States, Canada, and overseas UUFGC is democratic in operation; we govern ourselves. We are a "lay led" congregation, because we do not have a hired minister. Our governing body is our Board of Directors. We have no hired staff so all activities of the Fellowship are carried out by volunteers. At present the Administrative Team and a few other hardy volunteers carry out the day-to-day operations necessary for our happy functioning.

Each spring we hold a congregational

meeting. This is when we elect Board members for the year beginning July 1, set our annual operating budget, approve any proposed by-laws changes, and generally discuss Fellowship issues. All members are encouraged to attend and vote at this meeting, but may have a proxy vote for them if unable to attend. Special congregational meetings may be called if an important issue arises during the year which is beyond the scope of the Board. Our By-laws are on the UUFGC website, and are also included in the Membership Directory provided yearly to each member.

Our Board consists of seven members, President, President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer, and three at-large members. They meet monthly to discuss issues needing attention and make appropriate decisions. Members are welcome to attend these meetings and may request that items be placed on the agenda for discussion. A Board member also participates in meetings of the UU Network (see President John Hunger's column).

Standing committees report to the Board on their ongoing progress, needs, and wishes. In coming newsletters we hope to have information about those various committees and what they do. Of course your volunteerism is welcome!

**Used Book Sale:** There will be a book sale at the fellowship on January 9 from 9am till 2pm.


**Book Cluub:** The book club will meet on Wednesday January 13 at 7pm in
