One of the most poignant passages in the Bible occurs after Hagar and her son are abandoned to the desert by Abraham and Sarah. She prays, not to be rescued, but that she won't live long enough to witness the death of her only child. It is also a story, told entirely differently in Muslim tradition, with important implications. For these two, very different reasons, it is well worth a review. When have you felt totally abandoned, alone, and terrified? What happened to you? When have you heard a story one way all your life, only to discover a totally different version believed by others? Can we twine these two threads into a compelling message for religious liberals? Join us and see. Would it matter if Jesus never lived? Might this book help bring about the end of the Christian church? Or will a book like this just be ignored? And, also, what can we as Unitarians learn about life and truth and meaning from the persistence of the Jesus story? U.S. Foreign Policy Study Discussion Program to Begin February 10

Great Decisions, the annual, eight-week U.S. Foreign Policy study-discussion program will begin at UUGFC on Thursday, February 10, 2010. The UUGFC group will meet Thursday evenings at 7:30 pm for nine sessions but will not meet March 17 (spring break). A similar group is schedule to meet at Bay Area UUC.

Each week, participants read a topical section in a study-booklet (\$20) published by the Foreign Policy Association in New York (FPA). They then meet to discuss the topic for about an hour, after which they cast ballots, expressing their opinions on what policies the United States should adopt relating to the issue studied. The ballots are compiled by FPA with results being distributed to the President of the United States, U.S Secretary of State and Members of Congress.

Dr. Dotti Jones a former U.S. Foreign Service Officer and Director of International Education and Development at College of the Mainland, will lead the UUGFC group. Dr. Jones is currently Director of Leadership and Organizational Development at College of the Mainland. During her twenty years of employment at the college she has had many responsibilities, including her previous position of Director of International Education. She has served as a Diplomat in the Foreign Service with assignments in Brazil and Washington, DC. She was awarded a special assignment to serve as liason to the White House Press and world press in Portugal. While Director of Editorials for CBS in Philadelphia, she facilitated the Great Decisions Program for the Philadelphia World Affairs Council. Dr. Jones has studied at the Foreign Service Institute, Washington, D.C. and the School for International Education, Brattleboro, VT. She is affiliated with the Society for International Education, Training, and Research, an international organization. She also is well-established in the field of Leadership Development.
