Made In Dagenham

In 1968, the Ford auto factory in Dagenham was one of the largest single private employers in the United Kingdom. In addition to the thousands of male employees, there are also 187 underpaid women machinists who primarily assemble the car seat upholstery in poor working conditions. Dissatisfied, the women, represented by the shop steward and Rita O'Grady, work with union rep Albert Passingham for a better deal. However, Rita learns that there is a larger issue in this dispute considering that women are paid an appalling fraction of the men's wages for the same work across the board on the sole basis of their sex. Refusing to tolerate this inequality any longer, O'Grady leads a strike by her fellow machinists for equal pay for equal work. What follows would test the patience of all involved in a grinding labour and political struggle that ultimately would advance the cause of women's rights around the world.

Occupy Galveston to host movie, protest April 21

Occupy Galveston is showing a movie in Galveston on Saturday April 21, from noon to 2pm, in the McCollough Room at the Rosenberg Library, 2310 Sealy, off of Broadway and 24th.

The movie will be *The Corporation*, which has been called witty, stylish and sweepingly informative. The Corporation explores the nature and spectacular rise of the dominant institution of our time. Part film and part movement, The Corporation is transforming audiences and dazzling critics with its insightful and compelling analysis. Taking its status as a legal

"person" to the logical conclusion, the film puts the corporation on the psychiatrist's couch to ask "What kind of person is it?"

The Corporation includes interviews with 40 corporate insiders and critics - including Noam Chomsky, Naomi Klein, Milton Friedman, Howard Zinn, Vandana Shiva and Michael Moore - plus true confessions, case studies and strategies for change.

After the movie, there will be a short protest on Broadway and 23rd Street. Bring your signs and noisemakers.

The keynote speaker for the event is Juana Bordas, who is internationally known for her work promoting cross-cultural leadership, during a time when cross-cultural tension are inflamed.

Ms. Bordas will give a prepared talk (which is open to the public) and then conduct an interactive workshop for conference regristrants. As the SWUUC prepares for the General Assembly in Phoenix, the information and counsel she will provide will be invaluable.

Veteran broadcaster Dan Rather will be the featured speaker at Galveston's annual Arbor Day celebration, Friday, April 27, 2012.

Mr. Rather, longtime anchor of the CBS Evening News and a frequent contributor to 60 Minutes, currently hosts the weekly Dan Rather Reports on HDNet, a program specializing in investigative journalism and international reporting. Rather became nationally known in 1961 for his broadcasts from Galveston on Hurricane Carla, one of the most

powerful storms ever to strike the United States.

This year's Arbor Day will celebrate the community's efforts to replant the trees destroyed by Hurricane Ike's salt water storm surge in 2008, says Jackie Cole, President of the Galveston Island Tree Conservancy, a nonprofit established to replant the Island.

In honor of his visit, Mayor Joe Jaworski will issue a proclamation naming April 27, 2012 as Dan Rather Day in Galveston.
