Different from today, though, the ancient text describes a group hope whereas now we seem to cling more to individual hope, and a group god more than an individual one. Laura will relate stories from the Bible that outline these differences and talk about how Protestantism and Emerson's Transcendentalism fueled the shift from groupism to individualism. 



## **ANSWER** gives kids an opportunity to learn

When Earle Canfield spoke to our UU Fellowship on Sunday, Dec. 18, he brought a lot of attention to the problems that poor or lower caste children face when it comes to receiving the proper education.

His outreach organization ANSWER (American-Nepali Students' and Women's Educational Relief) is trying to rectify that problem by using a system that gets those children and women the proper education, and then relies on them to support others facing the same situation. Just nine years after founding the organization, the size of the effort has grow to having more than 500 children in 100 schools and colleges all over Nepal.

"Our mission is to educate children from the lowest castes and provide them with real lifelong careers so that they will be come the vanguard for real change in Nepal. They will be the ones pushing for universal, compulsory education and government scholarships, etc." Canfield states in his organization's Mission Statement.
