The final report was submitted in early July and soon after we received our official notification.

Madeleine Baker and Bets Anderson were among five Galveston badminton players who competed in the Senior Games in Cleveland, Ohio, last month. Eleven thousand athletes over 50 competed in

games ranging from basketball and volleyball to track and field events as well as swimming, cycling and running.

Small Group Ministry

Small group ministry is a cluster of groups which are intentionally led by trained facilitators to increase and deepen connections within our congregation. Opening Words

Check In

Reading/Topic

Meditation (optional depending on group desire).

Sharing/Deep Listening

Check Out

Closing Words

Topics are not a means to themselves but a tool for encouraging deep reflection and sharing. Deep/radical listening is a practice which allows each group member to speak without interruption. There is usually time for some discussion as well. Each group will also develop its own covenant or promise of right relations. Groups may also decide on a shared service project.

Groups will meet two times per month for 1½ hours at the fellowship. Membership is limited to 8 per group and group members are encouraged to commit to attending as many meetings as possible. Enrollment times for new members will be set periodically throughout the year.

New groups will begin in October and run through February. Sign up will begin in September.

Women's Circle co facilitated by Susan Baker and Diane Olsen


1st and 3rd Thursdays 6:00 – 7:30
